Do you know where your water comes from? Watersheds provide the fresh water that humans and fish, and lots of other creatures, need each day. Learn how to take care of the water in your watershed, and then spread the word!

A watershed is an area of land that drains to a particular body of water such as a river or a lake. Rain or any type of precipitation that falls anywhere in that watershed eventually flows to a body of water. The water may travel over land as surface water or flow underground as groundwater. Look around your community to see water traveling within our watershed.

Rules

- The 2013 theme “Where does your water shed?” must be on your poster. (Don’t use any other title)
- Any media may be used to create a flat or two-dimensional effect (paint, crayon, colored pencil, charcoal, stickers, paper or other materials on regular posters (no computer only special category)
- Poster size must be between 8.5" x 11" and 20" x 24".
- All posters must be created by an individual student rather than a team of students.
- Entries must have a completed entry form signed by a parent or guardian attached to the back of the poster.
- Although younger students will most likely receive help in planning from parents or teachers, NACD encourages each student to do as much of the work as possible by him/herself. Entries completed by students in their handwriting and coloring will score better than those designed, drawn and colored by adult assistance.

Poster Evaluations

The posters are evaluated on the following criteria:

- Conservation message (50 percent)
- Visual effectiveness (30 percent)
- Originality (10 percent) and
- Universal appeal (10 percent).

Prizes

- Local Prize: \$25, \$15 and \$10 awarded for 1st, 2nd and 3rd place in each category: grades K-1, 2-3, 4-6, 7-9 and 10-12.
- State winners will be eligible for National Association of Conservation Districts’ Poster Contest and prizes. See <http://nacdnet.org/education/contests/>
